The recent West Valley Human Services Scan, completed by the Valley of the Sun United Way and ASU, identified quality and affordable child care and access to healthcare in all service areas as an important and essential element to an improved quality of life. Our child care component aims to provide assistance to the growing number of caregivers who work outside the home and have care needs for both their children and their parents – caregivers who are known as the “Sandwich Generation.” Another emerging trend will be addressed by programs on our new campus – grandparents who are charged with the primary responsibility of raising their grandchildren.

According to the Pew Research Center, just over one out of every eight Americans aged 40 to 60 is raising a child and caring for a parent. In addition, the U.S. Census Bureau statistics indicate that the number of older Americans aged 65 or older will double by the year 2030, to over 70 million.

There is an urgent need for better pre-K activities offered by child care providers to empower children for success when they enter school. Over the past decade, early brain development research has revealed that the formative years of

zero to three are the most crucial in determining a child’s later success in school. On average, 48 percent of all children entering schools in Arizona do not have the essential skills needed. Currently there are approximately 10,041 children in Surprise under the age of five – over 11 percent of the total population.

In addition to the new building, we were able to secure a new food management company. By doing so, we have been able to better control food costs as well as quality. This has been a great transition for us.

We are also proud of the new training programs we have initiated for our staff to become even better at providing the quality care we are known for. Several of our employees have taken lead roles in becoming certified trainers in a particular area of expertise, such as CPR, Behavior Management and Fall Prevention. These staff leaders are now able to share their knowledge and teach other employees. A new scholarship program was also created in 2007 for staff to further their expertise in their field and ultimately help Interfaith better serve the community.

As always, we would also like to take this opportunity to thank all of our supporters and community partners for your involvement in our success as an agency. We appreciate your dedication and your assistance in helping us to fulfill our ultimate goal of helping those in need remain independent and living in their own homes for as long as possible. Interfaith could not continue to be recognized as the provider of choice in the Northwest Valley without your continued support.



## *A Place of Relief and a Place to Heal*

For Claudine Hathaway, Interfaith not only offered a place of relief, but also a place to heal.

For four years Claudine knew that her husband, Gary, who was diagnosed with Parkinson's disease, would be in a safe and caring environment when she dropped him off at the Sun City West Adult Day Program. The respite care was increasingly helpful for Claudine because as Gary's Parkinson's disease progressed, it took more out of Claudine to care for Gary. He was more and more dependent on his walker and susceptible to falling.

"All I can say is that it was a real lifesaver for me when Gary would stay at the day center," Claudine said. "I knew that he would be well taken care of by the staff."

Dropping Gary off at the day center meant that Claudine was able to volunteer her time to teach French at the Chez Nous Center and Café and run errands afterwards without having to worry about her husband's wellbeing. Claudine made friends and felt at home among the Interfaith community.

While it was a painful loss for Claudine when Gary passed away in May, she is now part of an Interfaith grief support group.

"It's sad, but helpful to get to know other people and hear each other's stories," Claudine said.

## *A Circle of Care - From Provider to Participant*



Bart Lockwood has seen both sides of Interfaith Community Care – as a day center activity leader and a participant.

While working for Interfaith in 1992, he loved his job. He enjoyed planning activities and events that were specially tailored for his participants. The last thing he expected was to become a participant himself. However, after a series of health complications that accelerated his Parkinson's disease and diabetes, Bart needed the help of Interfaith's Sun City Restorative Care Adult Day Center.

"Bart and I knew the value of the whole person being restored at Interfaith," Sharon Lockwood, Bart's wife, said. "Whether it's companion or physical therapy, there is nothing Interfaith can't help with."

After enrolling at the Sun City Restorative Care Adult Center, Sharon began to notice Bart improving. The nurses at the day center were patient and encouraging in helping Bart with physical therapy and exercises.

"I've noticed through daily activities that Bart is a lot stronger and that is all due to Interfaith," Sharon said. "The staff isn't here to make money. They are here because they care."

When Bart was an activity leader, he worked hard to ensure that all participants received personal attention and enjoyed every moment spent at the day center. Now as a participant, Bart is cared for just like the way he cared for others.



## *Center Provides Joy for the Gomez Family*

Jack and Betty Gomez knew that Interfaith was unique when their daughter, Millicent, who is developmentally challenged with Down's Syndrome, came home from the Peoria Adult Day Center happy and abounding with stories of her day.

"We've tried other day centers, but we like that the Interfaith staff and volunteers always engage their participants," Betty said. "We are allowed to visit Millicent anytime we want and when we do, we always see her busy with an activity."

Jack and Betty were originally Millicent's foster parents, but decided to adopt her after she was given back to her birthmother and then was released again soon after. Neither of them knew anything about Down's Syndrome and had to learn it all to care for Millicent.

Betty said she has greatly appreciated the amount of personal care the staff has provided Millicent. Betty added that since Millicent has been attending the day center, she noticed an improvement in her eating skills as the staff patiently worked with Millicent's motor skills during mealtimes.

"I don't worry about her when she's at the day center," Betty said. "I know that she is looked after all the time and she is never left alone."

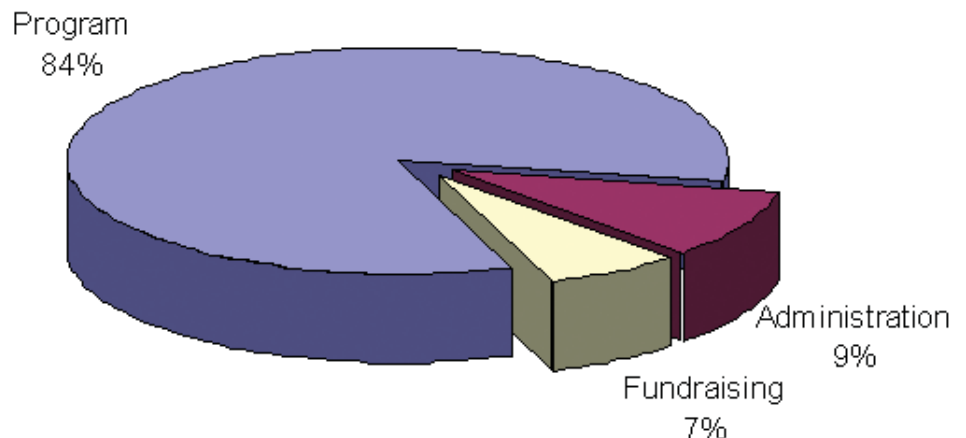
